## **ORDINANCE NO. 1352**

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ARTICLE 5 OF CHAPTER 14 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF HILLSBORO, KANSAS ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR TRUCK PARKING.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Hillsboro, Kansas (the "City") has previously adopted Chapter 14 of the Code of the City of Hillsboro, Kansas (the "Code") which contains provisions relating to traffic within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Hillsboro finds it necessary and advisable to establish Article 5 of Chapter 14 of the Code regulating truck parking.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HILLSBORO, KANSAS,

SECTION 1. Chapter 14, Article 5 of the Code is hereby created and reads as follows:

## **Article 5. Truck Parking**

## 14-501. Definitions

As used in this article:

- (a) "Truck" means transport, truck tractor, farm tractor, road tractor, or any vehicle of a licensed capacity of 24,000 pounds GVW or more.
- (b) "Trailer" refers to what is commonly known as a semi-trailer or tractor-trailer, whether fully enclosed or flat-bed.

## 14-502. Truck parking.

- (a) No truck and/or trailer shall remain parked for more than forty-five (45) minutes on any street within the City of Hillsboro.
- (b) No truck and/or trailer shall be allowed to have its engine or refrigeration unit motor running for more than forty-five (45) minutes in any 24-hour period on any street or private drive within any residential district within the City of Hillsboro.
- (c) No truck and/or trailer shall park on any street of the City so as to block the lanes of traffic or hinder the free flow of traffic from either direction, unless the same is necessary to accommodate the loading or unloading of the trailer, for a period not exceeding ninety minutes.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on and be in full force after its adoption by the governing body of the City, approval by the Mayor and either (a) publication once in the official newspaper of the City, or (b) publication of a summary hereof certified as legally accurate and sufficient by the City Attorney.
